9.	Discussion Items for consideration and action by the Board
a.	Danbury Citizens Petition to implement a K-6 configuration at Danbury Elementary School: Lauren Moran, a Danbury parent, read a signed petition to the Board. The petition is a request to reconfigure Danbury Elementary School to a K-6 school beginning with the 2013 – 2014 school year. Lauren Moran said she developed the petition after speaking with several parents at Danbury Elementary School and they agreed it would be a beneficial configuration. Vincent Paul Migliore referenced a town warrant article which stated, Danbury was to commence a study to withdraw from the District. He wanted to know if the Petition was related. Lauren said the main purpose of the Petition is to see what their options are in their own school; If we have the option of taking our own school back. Vincent Paul Migliore explained there is a 7% decrease in enrollment throughout the state. Our latest enrollment is 1,263. We have found the district has approximately 62 classrooms which could be handled in 42 – 45 classrooms. He concluded we are about a whole school too big. He suggested waiting for the report of the K-8 Study Committee before taking action. Dr. McCormack said there are implications for staffing. If you are going to reduce staff, you need to be sensitive to the legal notification timeline-you need to notify staff by April 15 th . Don Franklin questioned what our responsibility was with the presentation of a petition. Vincent Paul Migliore added there is a policy that says the Board has to do a longer study if we are closing a school. (Copy of the signed petitions is at the end of this document.)
b.	Recap of the Deliberative Session scheduled for February 2, 2013: Dan Rossner reported there was an estimate of 160 to 170 in attendance. Vincent Paul Migliore said the session went well. No articles were amended. The information on the Warrant Articles is as stands. He suggested, next year, we should consider the date of the first Saturday in February with the next Saturday as a snow date.



I would like to respectfully submit this letter and the enclosed petition to the Board. The undersgned of the petition request that the Danbury Elementary School be reconfigured to a K-6 school, beginning with the 2013-2014 school year.

As you are all aware, Danbury students currently attend DES through fourth grade and are then bused to the Bristol Elementary for fifth grade. After this, they are transitioned to the Newfound Middle School for sixth grade. We believe that this is simply too much transition in a short period of time for our students. We also feel that the time spent on the bus traveling to Bristol in 5th grade is not beneficial, as there are students on each route who are on the bus for up to an hour or more at a time. Instead, we request to have a combined 5th and 6th grade classroom added to Danbury Elementary School. We are already different from the other elementary schools in the district, in that they are all K-5 schools. If we were a K-6 school, we understand that we would still be different, but we feel that it would be a much more beneficial system for our students. It would save them unnecessary transitions, would prevent them from being on the bus for long periods of time in fifth grade, and would allow them to enter into a new, larger school at a later age in seventh grade, when they would presumably be more mature and self-confident.

In the past year, the Danbury Elementary School has undergone several changes in configuration. We are currently running with Kindergarten, first grade, second grade, and combined third/fourth grade classrooms. Because of these changes, there is still one classroom not being used as such. Therefore, there would be room to add a combined 5th/6th grade classroom. We would ask, however, that the 5th grade students who are currently attending BES and have already made this transition, be given the choice of either returning to Danbury or moving on to the Middle School next year. We want to make this change to eliminate unnecessary transitions, and would not want to add any for these students. This would mean that for the first year of a combined 5th/6th grade, the numbers may be somewhat low, and would then go up in the second year, but we believe that a combined 5th/6th grade classroom is the most cost-effective configuration.

Danbury parents are continually impressed with the staff and administration of our school and the education that our children are receiving. We feel that if our students were able to remain there through 6th grade, this would be a very positive opportunity for them to grow and mature further in their own close-knit school and community, and would serve to build confidence in them for the time when they would enter Middle School in seventh grade. In closing, thank you for your consideration of this request.
