<p>a.</p>	<p><b>Report of the Sub Committee on Zero-Based Budgeting Research</b> – Don Franklin said the consensus of the committee, going forward, is that the majority of organizations use a modified Zero-Based Budgeting. We are currently using this process and are on the right track. <b>No action.</b></p>	
<p>b.</p>	<p><b>Citizens request to alter BHVS to a K thru 8 school</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Stephanie Bednaz, Michele Hutchins and Stephanie Peters presented a request for a K-8 Pilot Study at the Bridgewater - Hebron Village School. They explained it would slowly be phased in. Stephanie Peters, from the Andover K-8 School District, spoke from a teacher’s perspective of the many benefits she has experienced. Michele Hutchins has done research and said more urban educators are actively pursuing a ‘smaller is better’ model. She summarized with three key factors of safety, engagement and achievement.</li> <li>Lloyd Belbin commented that we have the other communities to consider.</li> <li>Paul Fleming (Hebron) commented that his son did not make it in the lottery to attend the Bridgewater Hebron Preschool.</li> <li>Caroline Santamaria, asked what the protocol was for. Dr. Ross explained the practice of assigning children to their local school, either BES or BHVS depending on their address. (Alexandria has a dividing line.) The No Child Left Behind law states that any school that is on the list of Schools In Need of Improvement (SINI) must offer parents the right to request to place their child in another school that is not on the list.</li> <li>Don Franklin questioned if it is a study or if it is a Pilot. The reply from the panel was that it is a study to do a Pilot program.</li> <li>Johanna asked about clarification of the Pilot Program.</li> <li>Sue Cheney said the Middle School Model is not the most successful anywhere.</li> <li>Mimi Freeman questioned how it would be staffed.</li> <li>Vincent Paul Migliore said he would like to see some strong data to see what approach they will take. He would like to return as much control locally as possible.</li> </ul>

She wanted to know if it would affect this program.</li> <li>• Janet Cote, said we are a District, and if we are to do a feasibility study, we have to look at the cost and impact to the whole District. e.	<p><b>Receive and Review Auditor’s Report</b> – Dan Rossner provided the Board members with the auditors’ report. Dan pointed out there was one significant finding, which is an OPED finding. We don’t pay for health insurance for retirees. By NH State Law the retirees cost is based on a pool. Therefore we do not meet the requirements of GASB 45. We would need to engage an actuary; it is an amount we need to address. The other option would be to remove the retirees from the pool. <b>Placed on Consent Agenda Cross Reference 11 a</b></p>
